### THE WELLNESS COMMITTEE

This newly formed committee will share information and develop programs that address the interests and concerns of our community, including social, emotional and physical wellness.

### POWER OF WOMEN: SOCIAL SERIES

POW targets women between the ages of 40-55 (generally), and aims to provide high-quality programming as a means to introduce women to the work of JewishColumbus and encourage deeper involvement and increased Annual Campaign commitments.



### THE POMEGRANATE SOCIETY

The pomegranate is an ancient symbol found in Jewish art and ritual. All women who commit a household or individual gift of \$1,800 - \$4,999 to the Annual Campaign are part of the Pomegranate Society. Doing so is a declaration of your personal commitment to honor traditional Jewish values of justice (Tzedek) and acts of loving kindness (Gemilut Hesed).
