# **Antisemitism Power Point Talking Points**

As you lean into discussions on antisemitism, it's important to remain calm. Be open and honest. Lean into people asking questions, even if they inadvertently say something wrong.

### Key Facts/Points to learn:

### Israel & Judaism

- About the size of New Jersey, 9.3 million people
- Israel population- 9.4 million people, including 20% Arab population with full citizenship
- Jews have lived in the land of Israel CONTINUOUSLY for 4,000 years
- JEws in the diaspora (living outside of Israel) continued to think of Israel as their homeland up through it becoming a country
- We say "Next Year in Jerusalem" at the end of every major holiday
- Israel, Jerusalem, and key cities throughout Israel are mentioned in many prayers and in the Torah

# Founding of Israel

- Israel was officially founded in 1948
- Theodore Hertzl: Considered the father of Zionism. Promoted immigration to what is now Israel starting in the last 1800s, up until his death in 1904.
  - He hosted the First Zionist Congress in Switzerland. Now called the World Zionist Congress.
  - He founded the World Zionist Organization
  - He founded Jewish National Fund (JNF)- originally a way to buy land in Israel to help promote immigration. Now they focus on building a vibrant future for the state of Israel, but many Americans know they primarily for their tree planting work
- 3 key moments before the official founding in 1948:
  - 1917 Balfour Declaration- A public pledge by the British to establish a Jewish state in the territory then known as Palestine
  - League of Nations, British Mandate for Palestine in 1922, creating a plan to create a Nation for both Jews and Arabs in a large territory that is now Israel and Jordan (plus a little beyond).
  - United Nations Partition Plan of 1947: Adopted in November of 1947, it would create 2 nations in what is now Israel: a Jewish state and an Arab state.

 Jewish leadership participated and collaborated; Arab leadership boycotted

# Democracy

- Considered only functional democracy in the Middle East
- All citizens allowed to vote (21% not Jewish)
- 23 Islamic Countries, 1 Jewish Country
- None of the islamic countries are democracies
- Israel protects the rights of all citizens to practice their religion and also protects all holy sights temple mount, dome of the rock

# **Key Players**

- Iran and it's Axis of Resistance
  - Using other players to weaken and hurt Israel
  - Hezbollah southern Lebanon
  - o Hamas Gaza
  - o Houthis Yemen
  - Right now all at the weakest they've ever been due to Israel
  - All considered terrorist organizations by U.S. government
- Palestine Liberation Organization
  - Founded 1964
  - Represented Palestinians, led by Yassir Arafat until 2004
  - Mahmoud Abbas took over leadership 2004
  - Hamas grew in prominence and power and in 2006 took control of Gaza
     Strip
  - PLO remain in control of West Bank

### Terrorism and Wars against Israel

- Hebron Massacre of 1929: Arab members attacked a small pius town of Jews.
   Murdering nearly 70 people, more than 100 injured and Jewish homes +
   Synagogues were ransacked.
- War of Independence, 1948: attacked by 7 Arab countries following the Declaration of Statehood
- Six Day War, 1967: In response to Egypt closing the Straits of Tiran and positioning troops on the border in preparation for war
- El Al hijacking, 1968 (Entebbe)
- Yom Kippur War, 1973: Egypt and Syria attacked on the holiest day of the Jewish Calendar
- First Intifada, 1987-1990: Uprising, Protests devolved into violence

- Second Intifada, 2000: Following the Palestinian rejection of the Camp David Accords
- Gaza Operations, 2008-2009; 2012; 2014;
  - in response to escalating attacks by Hamas on Israel, particularly civilians via terrorist attacks and rocket fire
- Oct 7-present

# Peace Efforts- In all instances Israel accepted; PLO rejected

- UN Resolutions following Six Day War and Yom Kippur War
- Camp David Accords, 1978
- Oslo Accords
- Camp David Summit, 2000
- Disengagement and total Israeli withdrawal from Gaza, 2005
  - ultimately resulted in Hamas winning election and violently pushing out the Fatah party of the PLO
- Trump Peace Plan, 2020

#### October 7

- 1200+ men, women & children murdered; hundreds more injured
- Largest massacre of Jews since the Holocaust
- Included 46 Americans and citizens from more than 30 countries
- Women and girls brutally sexually assaulted
- Tens of thousands remain displaced
- Hamas took 251 Hostages into Gaza
- Dead Israelis were dragged through the streets of Gaza. Naked hostages were driven through Gaza.
- The depravity of Hamas's crimes is almost unspeakable.

### Since October 7

- Israel launched a ground offensive in late October 2023
- Civilian-to-Military deaths ratio among the lowest in wartime history approaching
   1:1
- More than 40,000 rockets have been launched at Israel from Gaza (Hamas), Lebanon (Hezbollah), Yemen (Houthi), and Iran
- More than 90,000 Israelis displaced in Northern Israel (rockets)
  - This is the equivalent to everyone living in Gahanna, Westerville, Bexley and New Albany being displaced and unable to go home.
  - Horrible devastation of the region due to constant rocket attacks
- Israel entered southern Lebanon attacking Hezbollah in summer of 2024

Ceasefire entered with Hezbollah November 2024

# Hostages

- 251 taken hostage into Gaza
- 63 Still held Captive
- 117 Returned alive
  - 105 through the Nov 2023 ceasefire
  - 8 rescued in summer 2024
  - 4 released by Hamas
- 71 Killed
  - 34 bodies remain in Gaza

#### Rise of Antisemitism

- In 2023, there were 8,873 anti-semetic incidents across the US, a 140% increase over the year before.
- Since Oct 7 this phenomenon has increased by over 300%
- More antisemetic incidents October 7th, 2023 January 7th, 2024 then there
  were the entire year of 2022.
- Jews are targeted in public, at homes, at synagogues, and in the workplace
- In 2023: 62% of religiously motivated hate crimes against Jews, yet Jews represent 2% of the population
- 70% of Jewish students report facing at least one form of antisemitism

# The Impact of Antisemitism

- Jews are increasingly harassed and ostracized in high schools, on college campuses and even on-lline.
- Jews have been physically attacked when displaying Jewish symbols and/or appearing in traditional orthodox dress.
- Rising cases of Jews are being discriminated against in professional associations and in the workplace

### What Can You Do?

- Antisemitism or Jew Hatred is not just a Jewish problem
- It is often considered the oldest form of prejudice and serves as a foundational hatred that can pave the way for other forms of bigotry and discrimination against different groups
- Antisemitism normalizes the idea of blaming an entire population for societal problems, which can then be applied to other minority groups.
- Speak up, say something

- Educate yourself (today!)
  - Learn the facts
  - This war is about an existential threat to Israel's very existence and the right for Jews to have their own homeland.
  - This is not about white colonists oppressing people of color
  - This is a war on Western Civilization, where extremist Jihadis are seeking to destroy Democracies.
- Celebrate Jewish culture with your neighbors/friends
- Advocate against antisemitism and anti-Zionism
- Advocate to protect the security of Jewish agencies

### **IHRA**

- Support efforts to codify the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance or IHRA definition of antisemitism at the Federal, State and Local Level.
- It provides a widely recognized and standardized framework for identifying and addressing antisemitic acts, helping to educate the public, institutions, and authorities on what constitutes antisemitism.
- It enables better monitoring and combating of antisemitic behaviors across different contexts and regions.
- Governor DeWine has issued an Executive Order accepting the IHRA definition, but that can only go so far.
- Working now on passing this definition into law at the Federal, State and/or local levels to help combat and prevent the issues we've seen nationwide and here in Columbus.
